Early Life and Career

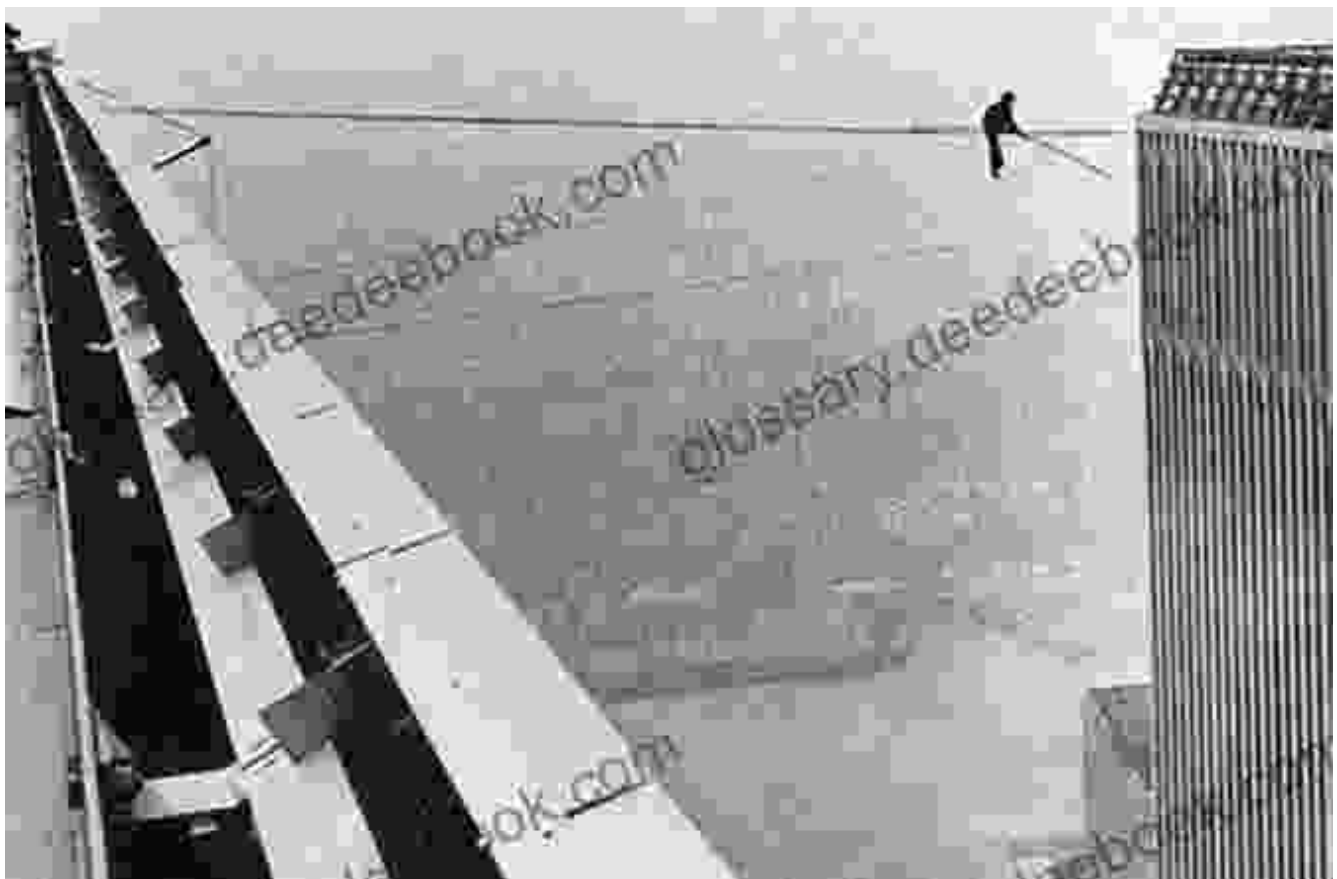

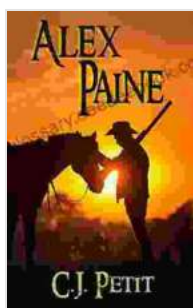

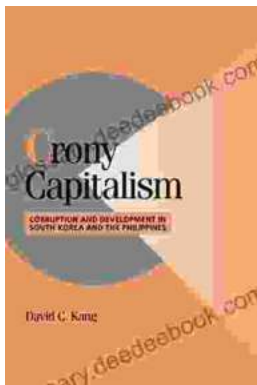
