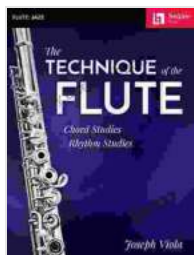

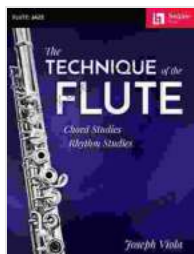
Vibrato
